

ANOTHER PIONEER DEAD

Hans Denison, Sr., died Wednesday morning at 6:15, January 1901, aged 79 years, 7 months. Mr. Denison's last illness continued several months, and he has been confined to his bed for several weeks. The funeral services will be held Saturday at one o'clock at the Tabernacle.

Deceased was born 20th July, 1821, in Gjentofte, Copenhagen, Denmark. He had three wives, two of whom preceded him to the grave. He was the father of twelve children, of whom, seven sons and two daughters, are living. There are eight living grandchildren and one dead; one living great grandchild and five dead.

Mr. Denison was baptized in the Mormon church in November 1851, and emigrated to Utah in the year 1853. He first settled in Spring City, and after a few years residence there he moved to where he has resided ever since.

Mr. Denison labored extensively in the erection of the Mormon Lake and St. George Temples since their completion has done much work for his dead relatives having taken endowments for several persons. He was devoted to his religion and for forty years acted as ward teacher.

During the Indian troubles Denison was always ready to take part in standing guard and in other duty devolving upon him. He endured all the trials incident to the early settlement of the county. He was an honorable citizen and respected by all who knew him. The family will have the sympathy of the entire community in their bereavement.
